

The Tiger Walk began at 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, with people lining up along South Donahue leading to the stadium. The procession was led by Aubie and the Auburn University Cheer Team. Following closely behind were the football team's coaches and players, ready to hand out high fives to waving fans.
